HOPE HOUSE UPDATE

God has used The Hope House ministry to affect so many lives. The Mission's Spiritual Recovery Program consists of Biblical studies, addiction recovery classes, chapels, the Mission Support Program, etc. The impact of the program is restoring families.

Hope House had the privilege of housing a young lady who had a history of homelessness. She came to Hope House 7 months pregnant, while sheltered her husband was able to go to rehab. She established relationship

counseling; she established visitation with her older children. Once her husband returned from rehab, he found employment and through community relationships the family was placed in an apartment which incorporated intensive case management so the family would continue to improve.
