Our living situation has been challenging for the last couple of months. Due to the problems with our house, we have been living in the upstairs of the church. While not ideal, we have made it work. We decided to move into the church building when we realized it would be impossible to heat the house this winter. We were running the heat all day in the house but could only get the temperature up to about 55°F. Our heating bill for the house was triple that of the church for a building less than half the size. This is not the first time we have had church in our home, but this is a temporary solution at best. Please continue to pray for the finances necessary to resolve our housing situation. We are extremely thankful for the churches that have sent offerings.

The rest of us are back to our winter routine of doing school and trying to stay warm. Thank you for all your prayers and support. We are thankful for partners who pray and give. May God continue to meet your needs as He has met ours.
