

But what if... You were a modern day, Helen Keller. Our Helen's life seems normal to her. No one knows she only sees shadows and reads through strong glasses sideways. Our Helen does not care about hearing aids, they squeal, and the background noise is too loud. If you speak loudly, and she listens; she can figure out what you are saying. It just sounds like your underwater. Our Helen lived alone for a year. The sympathetic

landlord realized he was unable to communicate with her and allow her to stay as long as possible. Our Helen thought she was paying the rent, but an online scammer withdrew her Social Security each month. I wonder what she thought when the court papers were delivered, and the eviction notice was taped to her door. I wonder how she felt when strange men moved her meager possession out on the street. I wonder if she noticed others trash mixed up with her precious things. It was February, she was cold, angry, and heart broken and the police brought her to the Hope House. Our Helen has resided at Hope House for one year. Everyone has a story; they have a history.

I often think of how an angel of the Lord spoke to Hagar in the wilderness, "Where are you going?" No matter how insignificant we feel we are always valued by God. Like Paul, Our Helen is sometimes a constant thorn, but she is a testimony of God's inexhaustible grace. How will Our Helen SEE, HEAR or FEEL the amazing power of God's love? She will, through our volunteers who come for coffee, lend a tolerant ear, and transport Our Helen to doctor appointments. Thank you for your generosity.

HAVEN HOUSE UPDATE

In August of 2024, Alexa came and joined the Haven House. She was previously employed as a substitute teacher for about 3 years, but stood up and fled a thirteen-year cycle of domestic violence. This left her homeless, she stayed at hotels and friends couches all while working and managing her three daughters.

Upon arriving at Haven House she walked to work, juggled children and continued to better herself. She paid for UBERS to take her children to court ordered visitation. Waiting three hours for them to return and then paying for a second UBER home. Alexa was determined to secure better employment and decided to obtain her bachelor's degree in science. She

enrolled in an online college and began working early morning hours and late at night to complete the lesson plans. She has less than one semester to completion.

The Martinsburg Union Rescue Mission is a recipient of Douglas Widmyer Education Fund. Alexa was preparing to test for The Praxis exam; we were so proud to be able to assist her with the cost for this exam. Alexa excelled on all testing. She has several other Certifications and CORE Tests to complete, which will be out of pocket fees. Alexa has completed Budget and Credit Counseling; she purchased a used car with her tax money. She is a wonderful example of the value of Stewardship.
