

HAVEN HOUSE UPDATE

Our Family program at Haven House host a measure of diversity. Each family is unique. Their history, size and composition are as individual as their last names. Initially, our families are seeking shelter, but ultimately our goal is to see them yield their lives to Christ and create a Godly household. One of our families consists of a young mother with two school-age children. Once her mother lost her battle with cancer, she

found herself living in the car with her children. Shortly after arriving at the Haven House her vehicle developed transmission problems, and she sold it to a junk yard. "Jewel" has struggled with multiple barriers including transportation, employment. childcare. She is a hard worker and loves her family. Jewel attempted to obtain her CDL and work for the school system, but she struggled with meeting the requirements of the CDL test. She is employed by a small local merchant, however the hours and pay will not support the young family. Jewel has given her life to the Lord. She is seeking God's Will and waiting for her next door to open. She is planning to enter

the military and take her children with her to live on base. We are seeking a tutor to help her study for the Armed Services Vocational Aptitude Battery; this will determine her military placement. Today we thank you for your prayers and support; we invite you to join us as we cheer on our families' accomplishments and encourage them while struggling with obstacles; reminding them to focus on our savior and watch God do the impossible.
