We finished up April by moving the church into the new building. The sanctuary is beautiful and we can't wait to see what God will do in this place. On Easter Sunday 10 people followed the Lord in believers baptism. They have proclaimed to the world their faith in Christ, and shown the fruits of becoming a new creature in Him. Please pray for our church as we disciple these new believers.

God has allowed us to serve Myanmar for 5 1/2 years now. Our family has added two sons that had never been to our homeland. Finally in the month of May we were able to make our first trip back to America. It is a long trip back taking more than 30 hours in flight time alone, not to mention long layovers and going through five different airports before reaching our destination. With four little ones, this was a monumental journey but God was so good to keep the baby happy during a long flight and the older three were real troopers. We were so proud of them! The day our wheels touched down in the USA we started a missions conference at our home church. During the rest of our 28 days, we reacquainted with some of our closest family members and their churches. My wife's grandfather, Bro. Kenneth McFadden, celebrated 60 years in the ministry as a pastor and preacher. All of the grandchildren were present and able to sing together in a very special service at our home church. Also, while we were in The States, New Horizon Baptist Church celebrated it's 50th year anniversary. This was an important event since my father has been pastor there for nearly 40 years and some of the charter members are still serving there in their 90's. These saints of God have invested in our lives so much over the years, even from my birth. They continue to pray for us every day. What a heritage! We were so thankful that our children had the opportunity to meet them on this side of Glory. The whole trip was a very happy reunion and we are thankful for the opportunity.

Back in Myanmar, the orphanage levels of the building are 99% finished, despite some delays because of the earthquake. Transition is leaving us with some challenges. We have a need for some full-time staff and leaders for the kids. Our current house parents will not be moving into the new rooms because of the wife's health and new baby about to arrive. Although Bro. Daniel can still work full-time at the home, there are some gaps that need to be filled with other godly staff. Change is hard for the kids too and we ask that you would pray for them in this situation. Sometimes we feel this sounds cliché, but we really mean it each time we say "thank you" to all of you who sacrifice financially and give time in prayer. The ministry cannot go on here without you!
