HOPE HOUSE UPDATE



Marie married a man who was a hard worker, had a son, friends, and close family. She didn't know when the voices began but they became very loud and told her she was worthless, they shouted and kept her from sleeping, there was confusion with every thought. Maria told her mother about the voices; she was taken to the church where they tried to perform an exorcism. Hopeless, Maria left home and lived under a local bridge and was in and out of local shelters for years.

One day she came to the mission and asked if we had a place for women. We took her to Hope House and realized quickly she needed mental health assistance. We scheduled appointments for her, but she felt

the need to return to "her" bridge. My heart broke. I felt Naomi in the book of Ruth, broken and returned to Bethlehem. Gratefully we serve a God who can reach under the bridges.

About a month later she asked to return to Hope House. We began working with her, loving her and accepting the idiosyncrasies that came with her. We knelt at the side of her bed with her and asked Jesus to heal her mind and give her the peace she longed for. Through love, medication, prayer and patient believers; Maria came to believe Jesus loves her and with him there is hope.

We advocated appointments, prescription changes and counseling. After months of hard work, there was a profound change, her psychiatrist and family were in shock at how well she looked and how she had begun to interact with the world. Today Marie is seeking employment and hoping to reestablish a relationship with her son. We thank you for your gifts of service, prayer and financial provision.

HAVEN HOUSE UPDATE

Fall has arrived and the temperatures are dropping. Families are heading to the pumpkin patches, and school is in full swing. Marsha called Haven House and asked if there was room for her and her child. She stated she and her child were sleeping on a relative's porch and they were cold and wet from the previous night's rain.

Upon picking her up, we realized this family had been struggling for years. Her daughter is autistic and in need of surgery. This young mother has attempted to overcome multiple obstacles, including domestic violence, and the attempted drowning of her daughter. Overwhelmed, we began to assess the immediate needs, food, shelter, dry clothes and medical services. Now work begins.

We are told, "You never truly know someone till you walk in their shoes". Now we all understand the screaming in the middle of the night, the tiny pieces of paper torn. Chicken nuggets 3 meals a day and 7 days a week. And the head bumps

instead of the much-needed hug and now we understand terms like sensory overload.

Scripture reminds us: Whatever you did for one of the least of these brothers and sisters of mine- you did for me." Matthew 25:40.

We trust God to provide the needs of our families. Every family who comes to Haven House is new territory and individual. We covet your prayers, gifts and understanding. Thank you for supporting us and may God Bless You richly.
