Construction

Winter arrived in Romania at the end of September. We have moved back into the upstairs of the church building for the foreseeable future. We still keep enough heat on in the kitchen at the house to keep the pipes from freezing, but even that comes at a cost. Our heat bill for the house last month was twice that of the church building. We are thankful that we have space in the church building to accommodate our family during this time, though we look forward to having a functional house to call home.

We praise God for the continued progress we have seen as we work toward building a house for our family. Lili has been working to get all the paperwork processed so that we can begin construction in the spring. As of now, all paperwork is in order and ready to go. We have also had a preliminary meeting with the architect to discuss paperwork and designs for the house. We also thank God for the additional funds that we have received, including a generous offering from First Baptist Church in Litchfield, MI. That brings us to just under \$100,000. We still need approximately \$60,000 more to reach our goal. Please pray that God would provide the necessary finances to meet our housing needs.
